

CONSUMER EDUCATION

A class in personal finance is required for all students to graduate. Consumer Education may supplement this class.

It shall be the responsibility of the high school principal to see that the high school will provide instruction in consumer education via an inter-disciplinary approach in the existing courses or as a separate course and as approved by the state superintendent. Instruction will be provided in the following areas:

- Taxes
- Checking Accounts
- Banking
- Credit
- Advertising
- Insurance
- Investments
- Budgets
- Consumer Purchasing
- Fundamental Principles of Economics
- An individual's role in the global economy is taught through a brief unit on quality of life, which is a comparison of the USA and two foreign countries.
