## **ART INSTRUCTION**

- A. The K-12 art committee comprised of all art teachers and representatives from elementary school teachers will submit to the Board for approval a balanced and comprehensive curriculum that shall include instructional experiences in sensory awareness, cultural heritage, aesthetic discrimination, and studio opportunities in a wide variety of two (2) and three (3) dimensional art processes.
- B. Equipment and supplies necessary for the appropriate art instruction will be requisitioned and purchased by the district to ensure that the district's responsibilities to adequately meet the needs of the art education program as described in state laws relating to art education will be complied with by the school.
- C. All students in grades  $K 4^{th}$  will be provided art instruction by a certified art instructor under the supervision of a Department of Public Instruction certified art teacher. The certified art teacher will have released time to supervise the elementary art program and consult through in-service activities as well as in the elementary classrooms.
- D. Art instruction shall be an available elective course for all students, grades 5-12, and shall be taught by a certified art teacher.
- E. The art curriculum and leadership committee will periodically review and submit to the superintendent their recommendations of an overall art program of the school and curricular offerings altered to reflect the changes and needs of society.
