U.S. Secretary of Education Names Colby Elementary a 2015 U.S. Department of Education Green Ribbon School

April 22, 2015

Managing Director of the White House Council on Environmental Quality Christy Goldfuss joined U.S. Secretary of Education Arne Duncan to announce that Colby Elementary School in Colby WI is among the 2015 U.S. Department of Education Green Ribbon Schools award honorees.

Colby Elementary was nominated by the Wisconsin Department of Public Education.

The school started a composting effort in the elementary to reduce the amount of food waste and learn how things break down and become useful again. This compost is then used in growing food. Electricity usage is tracked and the elementary school is in competition with other buildings. Students gather recyclable paper and cardboard to keep it out of the garbage/landfill. Milk cartons from breakfast, lunch and milk break are all recycled to keep them out of the garbage as well.

Staff and students made five cold frames that have been used to grow fruits and vegetables. Lettuce, cabbage, and onions is harvested from the school garden and used in the hot lunch program and as a teaching tool for classes.

The school is also taking steps to include more environmental and sustainability education by expanding the area near the cold frames to make it a handicap accessible outdoor classroom space. This also encourages teachers to find cross curricular areas that are environmental and/or sustainability related and focus on them. A new curriculum series for reading/language arts was selected because of the increase in non-fiction science and social studies related themes.

"Sustainability is very much a collaborative effort in our building. Everyone contributes in some way. Students, staff, and support people all respect what we are doing and it has become part of the culture of our building. It's just the way we do business here at Colby Elementary." Brenda Medenwaldt, Elementary Principal

In total, across the country, 58 schools and 14 districts were honored for their exemplary efforts to reduce environmental impact and utility costs, promote better health, and ensure effective environmental education, including civics and green career pathways. In addition, 9 colleges and universities were honored for the Postsecondary Sustainability Award. Duncan and Goldfuss made the announcement at the U.S. Department of Education, in Washington, DC.

"These honorees are compelling examples of the ways schools can help children build real-world skillsets, cut school costs, and provide healthy learning environments," Duncan said. "U.S. Department of Education Green Ribbon Schools are an inspiration and deserve the spotlight for embodying strong examples of innovative learning and civic engagement. We also are thrilled to add institutions of higher education to the list of honorees this year for the first time in the award's history."

The schools, districts, and postsecondary institutions were confirmed from a pool of candidates voluntarily nominated by 30 state education agencies, with honorees selected from 28 jurisdictions. The list of 81 total selectees includes 52 public schools and six private schools. The public schools include two charter and three magnet schools. The schools serve various grade levels, including 35 elementary, 19 middle and 17 high schools are among them, with several schools having various K-12 configurations, from 28 of the nominating authorities. Forty-seven percent of the 2015 honorees serve a disadvantaged student body, 22 percent are rural, and one-third of the postsecondary institutions are community colleges. U.S. Department of Education Green Ribbon Schools Summary of Achievements for Colby Elementary School

Colby Elementary School serves students in grades kindergarten through four in rural north central Wisconsin. Their work is a great example of a school doing a lot with what they have through increasing efficiencies and promoting behavior change. More than 40% of these students come from economically disadvantaged households and 21% are limited English proficient. Colby School District was chosen by CESA 10 to be part of an environmental initiative to help the school get started and moving in the right direction with sustainability and environmental education. CESA representatives met with the staff many times throughout the years to help work toward reducing environmental impact and costs, improving health and wellness, and increasing environmental education. The administrators, staff, and students have been very receptive to the efforts.

Pillar I: Reduced Environmental Impact

The school started a composting effort in the elementary to reduce the amount of food waste and learn how things break down and become useful again. This compost is then used in growing food. Electricity usage is tracked and the elementary school is in competition with the middle school and high school to see whose building can save the most energy over the year. Students gather recyclable paper and cardboard to keep it out of the garbage/landfill. Milk cartons from breakfast, lunch and milk break are all recycled to keep them out of the garbage as well.

Pillar II: Improved Health & Wellness

The school has implemented the changes required by the national lunch program, which jump-started efforts to get healthier foods for the hot lunch program. Staff and students made five cold frames that have been used to grow fruits and vegetables. Lettuce, cabbage, and onions is harvested from the school garden and used in the hot lunch program and as a teaching tool for classes. The Staff Wellness Committee produces a monthly newsletter and has many incentives for staying fit and healthy.

Pillar III: Effective Environmental and Sustainability Education

The school is also taking steps to include more environmental and sustainability education by expanding the area near the cold frames to make it a handicap accessible outdoor classroom space. This also encourages teachers to find cross curricular areas that are environmental and/or sustainability related and focus on them. A new curriculum series for reading/language arts was selected because of the increase in non-fiction science and social studies related themes.

Cross-Cutting Questions

Colby Elementary School is recognized as a "Sugar Maple" School through Green & Healthy Schools Wisconsin and are a nationally certified PLT *GreenSchool!*

Parents helped build and maintain the outdoor classroom and landscaping in the front of the school. The building is open for community members to walk before and after school. Excess produce from the cold frames is shared with the community.

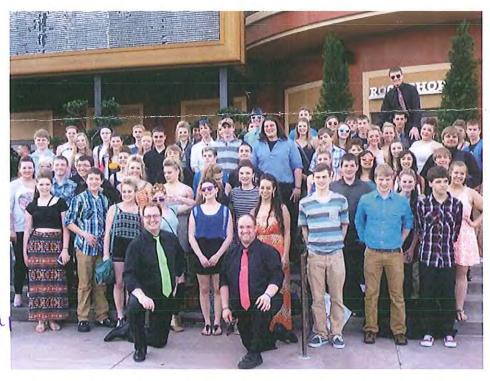

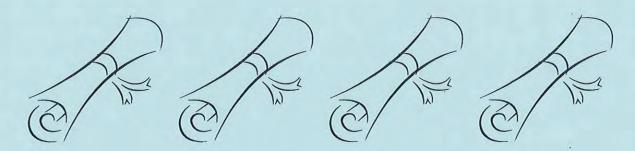

e.serviceo ELECTRONIC FUNDS TRANSFER AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, is made and entered as of the date that the last party to the agreement executes it between VANCO SERVICES, LLC ("Vanco")

and School District of Colby

("Company").

RECITALS:

- A. Vanco provides services to its customers pursuant to various e.servicea programs;
- B. Company desires to purchase e.servicea Electronic Funds Transfer Services ("e.servicea EFT") from Vanco pursuant to the terms and conditions of this Agreement; and
- C. For the purpose of this Agreement, "notice" or "notification" may be given in person, by United States Mail with postage prepaid, or by means of electronic communication to the last known address of the other party.

Vanco and Company hereby agree as follows:

- 1. <u>e.service</u>, <u>EFT</u>, e.service
 EFT is an electronic funds transfer service utilizing the Automated Cleaning House ('ACH") Network. e.service
 EFT may include programming and data base management services as requested by Company. Pursuant to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, Vanco will collect amounts due Company from Company's customer ("Customer").
- 2. <u>COMPANY DUTIES</u>. Company agrees to comply with all of the rules and procedures of Vanco pertaining to e.service@ EFT ("Client Procedures"). Company acknowledges receipt of the Client Procedures. The Client Procedures may be amended from time to time by Venco upon thirty (30) days notice to Company. Company will be bound by any amendments to the Client Procedures thirty (30) days after Vanco notifies it of the amendments.

In order to initiate any transaction, the Customer must execute an authorization for a direct debit to their checking or savings account for the amount which that Customer owes Company. Such authorization form must be obtained prior to initiating the transaction.

 VANCO DUTIES. Vanco will utilize an Originating Depository Financial Institution ("ODFI") to initiate the electronic funds transfer entries. Company acknowledges that Vanco and the ODFI are bound by ACH rules, regulations and guidelines.

The settlement of the debit transactions for the Customer and the crediting of those transactions to Company's depository account maintained at its financial institution ("Company's Account") shall all be made pursuant to ACH rules. At no time will the settlement amounts be deposited in or credited to Vanco's bank account.

- 4. PROGRAM CHARGES AND TAXES. Company agrees to pay Vanco monthly for Program Charges for e.services EFT by an ACH debit to Company's Account or another account designated by Company. Said Program Charges, which Company acknowledges receiving from Vanco, may be modified at any time upon thirty (30) days notice to Company. The Program Charges are small in relation to the amount of funds processed by Vanco pursuant to this Agreement. The Program Charges have been established based upon the limitation of liability set forth in Paragraph 7.
- 5. COMPANY WARRANTIES. Company hereby warrants as follows:
 - a. That the authorization received from the Customer is genuine and enforceable;
 - b. If it initiates a debit entry for the Customer by utilizing Vanco's internet site or if it sends Vanco a data file which permits Vanco to initiate the transaction without itself entering the data, it is in possession of an authorization for each such debit entry as well as any modifications or changes made to the original authorization for a debit entry and it shall maintain copies of such documentation for two (2) years following termination or revocation of the authorization;
 - c. That any and all Customer requests to terminate the authorization to debit their bank account have been provided to Vanco unless it has utilized Vanco's internet site or if it sends Vanco a data file which permits Vanco to initiate the transaction without itself entering the data and is bound pursuant to Subparagraph b to maintain copies of the authorization;
 - d. Each debit entry is for an amount which will be due and owing to Company on the settlement date for a sum specified to be paid to Company or is to correct a previously transmitted entry;
 - e. That it will not initiate any debit entry which violates any law or regulation;
 - f. That it shall be responsible for and pay the ODFI for any credit entries originated and any debit entries returned by the RDFI (Receiving Depository Financial Institution) when the ODFI does not receive payment from Vanco;
 - Gompany has not received any bankruptcy notice or other notification which would in any manner bar the debiting of the Customer's bank account;
 - h. That if the amount of the debit entry to be initiated to the Customer's account is different from the amount of the immediately preceding debit entry, that

- Company has sent the Customer notification of the amount of the entry and the date on or after which the entry will be debited;
- It assumes the responsibilities of an Originator under the NACHA Rules (National Automated Clearing House Association), which includes but is not limited to being bound by Article 5 of the NACHA Operating Rules regarding returned entries. An "Originator" is an entity (such as Company) that agrees to initiate ACH entries into the ACH Payment System; and
- j. Company is a tax exempt entity.
- 6. <u>COMPANY LUBBILITY</u>. Company shall be liable for all damages which Vanco suffers by reason of Company's breach of any of its warranties set forth in Paregraph 5 of this Agreement or by reason of any other representation made by it in this Agreement. In no event shall Company be liable for any consequential, special, punitive or indirect loss or damage.
- 7. VANCO LIABILITY. Vanco shall be responsible for performing only those services expressly provided for in this Agreement and shall be liable only for material losses directly resulting from its intentional misconduct in performing those services. Except as provided in the preceding sentence, Vanco shall not have any liability for failing to perform, for delay in performing or for negligently performing any services pursuant to this Agreement, and shall have no liability for any consequential, special, punitive or indirect loss or damage.
- 8. <u>INDEMNIFICATION</u>. To the extent permitted by law, each party ("Indemnifying Party") hereby agrees to indemnify, defend and hold the other, and all its officers, directors, owners, agents, employees, information providers, affiliates, licensors and licensees ("Indemnified Parties") harmless from and against any and all liability and costs incurred by the Indemnified Parties, including, without limitation, attorneys' fees and costs, in connection with any claim arising out of any breach by Indemnifying Party of this Agreement, including without limitation breach of the warranties and representations made in this Agreement, or its provision of the services and products to be provided pursuant to this Agreement except when the conduct of the Indemnified Parties giving rise to the liability is willful misconduct or negligent.

In the event that it is necessary to make a reversing entry for any debit transaction to a Customer's account by reason of insufficient account funds, a withdrawal of the authorization by the Customer, or for any other reason, Company hereby authorizes Vanco to debit Company's Account in order to settle such reversing entry and Company hereby indemnifies Vanco for all amounts which are subject to such reversing entries.

- TERM. This Agreement shall continue in effect, unless terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days notice. Provided, however, that in the event that any of the following occur:
 - a. Vanco attempts to make a debit to Company's Account pursuant to Paragraph 4 or Paragraph 8 of this Agreement which is later returned because the account has insufficient funds in it to permit the debit transaction,
 - Company has terminated Vanco's authorization to debit Company's Account, for any other reason which prevents Vanco from making the debit entry, or
 - c. Company breaches any of its warranties in Paragraph 5,

Vanco shall be entitled to terminate this contract immediately upon the occurrence of such an event and thereafter give notice to Company that this Agreement has been terminated.

- 10. CONFIDENTIALITY. Vanco acknowledges that in performing services for Company pursuant to this Agreement that it will have access to information about Company and Customers that is confidential, including, without limitation, "Personally Identifiable Information," as defined by the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, 34 C.F.R. Part 99 ("Confidential Information"). Vanco agrees to maintain the confidential Information to third persons, either in whole or in part, and will not in any manner disseminate Confidential Information for its own benefit. Vanco shall also take such steps as are reasonable and necessary to cause its employees to be individually subject to an obligation to maintain the confidentiality of Confidential Information.
- 11. <u>MISCELLANEOUS</u>. This Agreement shall constitute the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior oral or written representations, conditions, warranties, understandings, proposals or agreements regarding e.services EFT. This Agreement may be modified or amended only by a duly authorized written agreement executed by the Parties hereto. This Agreement does not and is not intended to confer any rights or remedies upon any person other than the parties.

e.service® ELECTRONIC FUNDS TRANSFER AGREEMENT

The laws of the State of Minnesota (without giving effect to its conflicts of law principles) govern all matters arising out of or relating to this Agreement, including, without limitation, its validity, interpretation, construction, performance, and enforcement.

All of the provisions of this Agreement shall survive its termination except for Vanco's obligation to provide e.service_® EFT to Company.

This Agreement may not be assigned by either party except that either party may assign this Agreement to any successor by sale of all or substantially all assets, merger, consolidation or corporate reorganization.

Each party hereby warrants and represents that the person whose signature appears below has been duly authorized and that all of the necessary and appropriate corporate authority exists for said party to execute this Agreement.

SCHOOL DISTRICT OF COLBY PUPIL TRANSPORTATION CONTRACT July 1, 2015 – June 30, 2022

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into this 18th day of May 2015, by and between the SCHOOL DISTRICT OF COLBY, WISCONSIN (hereinafter referred to as "District") and BURNETT TRANSIT, INC. (hereinafter referred to as "Contractor"), for the consideration herein expressed:

THE CONTRACTOR:

- Shall transport designated school pupils required to be transported by the District from designated points on designated routes, to and from designated schools, according to the routes and schedules determined by school authorities.
- 2. In performing this service for the District, the Contractor specifically agrees:
 - To furnish school buses conforming to all applicable state and federal laws, rules, and regulations adequate in number to perform the services contracted for;
 - B) To provide a bus garage to house pupil transportation buses while not in operation;
 - C) To maintain all school buses so that they will be at all times in good mechanical condition and clean when used for transportation of pupils;
 - D) To provide such maintenance facilities, equipment, fuel, and supplies adequate to perform the services contracted for;
 - E) To furnish school bus drivers licensed by the State of Wisconsin in adequate numbers to fulfill the requirements of this contract with photo copies of each driver's license provided to the District office upon request prior to the driver operating a bus in the District;
 - To provide assurances to the District that personnel practices comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act, required physical examinations, and applicable drug testing regulations;
 - G) To provide each driver with a handbook including information and requirements as to appearance, conduct, and for procedures for maintenance of the bus before and during use;
 - H) To equip all regular school buses with two-way radios or equivalent technology;
 - To comply with the "Video Cameras on School Buses" policy all policies and procedures established by the District;
 - J) To furnish to the District all information necessary for the completion of required Department of Public Instruction reports including the information for the transportation report in a timely manner.
 - K) To conduct all school bus operations under this contract in accordance with all applicable laws, rules and regulations of the State Department of Public Instruction, State Department of Transportation, State Department of Public Safety, and the District now in effect or hereafter adopted; The contractor shall also comply with all local laws and ordinances relating to road conditions and road restrictions;
 - L) To keep in force during the term of the contract in accordance with Wisconsin Statutes Section 121.53 liability insurance for each bus in the amount of \$500,000 per any one person, \$1,000,000 per accident and \$100,000 property damage for any one accident. Copies of said policies are to be made available to the District Office upon request.
- 3. Out-of-state trips will be subject to Federal and State DOT regulations and will be handled on a case-by-case basis with the School Board or the School Administration.
- The Contractor is an independent contractor and not the employee or agent of the District.
 All drivers shall be considered an agent of the Contractor.

THE DISTRICT AGREES:

- To pay the Contractor by the end of the first week of each month for all regular bus route services performed the previous month.
- 2. To pay the Contract within five (5) days after the board meeting each month for all authorized trips made and billed for the previous month provided the Contractor relays such bill to the District to be received no later than the Monday prior to the regularly scheduled board meeting. High School Student activity account trips will be billed separately.
- That if at the start of the 2018-19 or any subsequent school years, compensation negotiations are not successful, the rates in effect at that time will be in effect for the ensuing school year.

COMPENSATION: In January of 2018 either party may open compensation negotiations for the following two years and discuss extending the contract. IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE TERMS OF THIS CONTRACT, the District agrees, in the 2015-16 and 2016-17 school years of the contract to pay:

- 4. PROJECTED DAILY RIDERSHIP If, by July 1 of each year the projected bus ridership for the ensuing school term falls below 80% of the stipulated capacity of a bus, the District may request reconfiguration of the contractor's bus routes in order to consider elimination of the bus and to recover the savings in contract costs for the District.
- 5. **FUEL COSTS** extreme fluctuation in fuel costs will be handled in this way:
 - ♦ If the cost of fuel rises above \$2.27 per gallon the District will pay the additional cost based on the actual amount spent for the contract year 2013-14.
 - ♦ If the cost of fuel rises above \$2.57 per gallon the District will pay the additional cost based on the actual amount spent for the contract year 2014-15.
 - ♦ If pump prices for premium diesel rise above \$4.25 for 10 consecutive days, either party may reopen contract negotiations.
- 6. **INSURANCE COSTS** In recognition of escalating insurance costs, reduced options for insurance vendors, the contractor's need to budget these as fixed costs, as well as the district's confidence that students being transported are satisfactorily insured, the district will reimburse the annual insurance increase per bus up to \$525; the contractor will provide documentation of the increase in bus insurance for the district's annual audit.

7. SPECIAL EQUIPMENT - In the event any special or additional equipment (i.e. equipment other than substitute or replacement equipment) is required, or modification to the regular equipment becomes necessary to accommodate the District in the transportation of any student or students not contemplated, or if routes and schedules set forth are modified, the District shall notify the Contractor of such special equipment needs or route changes and shall reimburse the contractor any equitable basis for providing said equipment if the Contractor does in fact provide such equipment or services.

ADDITIONALLY THE CONTRACTOR AND DISTRICT AGREE:

- The Superintendent of Schools and the School Board are designated as the sole and exclusive agents of the District for communication between the District and the Contractor for all purposes.
- The Contractor may not assign or transfer any rights hereunder without 60 days written
 notice and written approval of the District. In the event that the Contractor seeks to sell the
 school transportation contract to another party, the Board shall retain the right to renegotiate any or all parts of this contract.
- 3. This agreement was negotiated by the parties. Both are equally responsible for the drafting hereof and no presumption shall arise there from.
- 4. Whatever contract language provisions the School District of Colby approves for one bus contractor will be offered to the other contractor(s) with the District.
- 5. This contract may be amended in the month of February each year of the existing contract by mutual agreement. Failure of the Contractor to open negotiations in February will result in the current rates to be in effect for the ensuing school year.
 - Failure or refusal of either party to substantially perform the conditions of this contract during the term of the contract will permit the other part to terminate the contract upon 30 days written notice to the breaching party, unless within such 30-day period the breaching party shall correct the performance to the reasonable satisfaction of the other party or submit the matter to arbitration. Neither party shall be required to accept less than full performance of this contract unless other wise agreed in writing by the parties.
- 6. The District reserves the right to request the removal of a driver from a route in the case of:
 - A) Persistent discipline problems.
 - B) Unsafe operation of vehicle.
 C) Improper conduct including, but not limited to such conduct as defined in Trans 300.16.
- 7. Failure to provide services because of extreme bad weather conditions, or because of road conditions which render the same impassable shall not be adjudged a breach of contract. School closing due to said conditions shall be at the discretion of the Contractor upon consultation with the Superintendent or his/her designee.
- All notices under this contract required to be given to the District shall be directed to the Superintendent of Schools at the District Office. All notices required to be given to the Contractor shall be directed to B3866 Hwy. 13, Spencer WI 54479 the address below.
- 9. This agreement shall be in effect for five (5) seven (7) school years (from July, 2015 to June 30, 2022) containing approximately One Hundred Eighty (180) days per school year).

SECTION: BOARD OF EDUCATION

BOARD MEMBER COMPENSATION AND EXPENSE PAYMENTS TO BOARD MEMBERS

- A. A School Board member may be paid for each regular, special or committee meeting of the Board attended as a member or when attendance is authorized by Board action.
- B. Any Board member, while representing the school board at a meeting as official representative, is eligible for reimbursement of expenses.
- C. Multiple meetings in a single day requiring a single trip will be compensated as a single meeting.
- D. Board member compensation will be determined at the School District annual meeting.
- E. Compensation for the President, Clerk and Treasurer of the Board of Education will be determined at the Annual Meeting.

SECTION: SCHOOL-COMMUNITY RELATIONS

RELATIONS WITH FAMILY AND COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS (SUNDAY ACTIVITIES)

The Colby School District will not schedule student activities, including athletic practices, club meetings, play practices, band practices, or choir practices on Sunday, except as follows:

- Athletic practices may be scheduled on a Sunday on the rare **RARE** occasion that a WIAA tournament game is scheduled on a Monday or Tuesday or in the case of a regular season game being scheduled on the next Monday. These practices must have prior approval from the athletic director and/or principal. In addition, the coach will notify the parents of the involved athletes.
- ➤ Play practices, band practices, and choir practices may be scheduled on Sunday if they have a Monday performance. These practices must have prior approval from the principal. In this instance, the advisor will notify the parents of the involved students.
- Any other exceptions must be approved in advance by the building principal. Final determination will be made by the district administrator. Scheduling of consistent practices (more than twice in a month) must be approved by the Board of Education. Exceptions should be kept to a minimum.

Any student requesting in advance to the director / coach, will be released from Sunday activities for family and community organizational activities will be released without pressure or penalty.
