

## EMERGENCY NURSING SERVICES

- A. An Advisory Committee composed of the School Safety Coordinator, a designated administrator, School Health Nurses, and Medical Advisor to the County Health Committee will plan and implement the school health and safety program.
- B. The Advisory Committee will be responsible for striving to reduce the number of accidents and injuries through development and implementation of emergency care program.
- C. The school will have detailed written procedures for handling all anticipated emergencies including parental approval for transportation and emergency medical service.
- D. The School Board will contract for emergency nursing service from the Clark County Nursing Service, under direction of the Clark County Medical Advisor and the Marathon County Health Unit.
- E. Designated personnel will be responsible to implement the necessary recommended Emergency Care Policies and Procedures in the school building during all operating hours. The booklet, Emergency Care Policies and Procedures for Wisconsin Schools, published by the Wisconsin Department of Health and Family Services, will provide the principles to follow in all emergency situations and emergency care procedures are given.
- F. The School Board shall provide the opportunity for all employees designated to assist in the emergency nursing and safety programs to take the Red Cross First Aid Course (to include Cardio-pulmonary Resuscitation). All school employees should be made aware of the emergency care program and who the designated personnel are to be contacted.
- G. The school maintain confidentiality of student health records in accordance with state law and board policy.
- H. The school shall provide in each building a designated health area or room. Equipment and supplies adequate for the emergency nursing service shall be provided for the designated health area.
