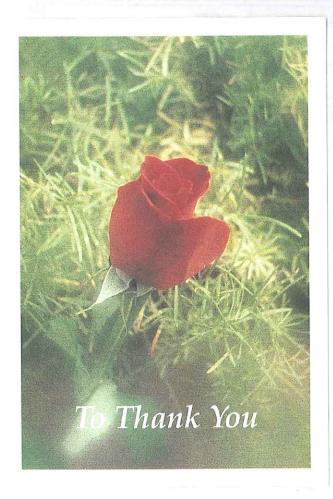

The Regular School Board Meeting on May 20, 2013, was called to order at 7:30 p.m. at the Colby District Education Center by Board Vice-President, Cheryl Ploeckelman. Members present were, Eric Elmhorst, Donna Krueger, Todd Schmidt, Lavinia Bonacker, Cheryl Ploeckelman, and Seth Pinter. Mr. Kolden reviewed the new post-retirement employment of WRS annuitants that is proposed in the State Budget Bill. Mr. Kolden completed a Wisconsin School Public Relations Association (WSPRA) Communication Survey and will be receiving survey results and updates. If Colby is awarded the sectional track meet for 2014 to be held on Friday, May 30, 2014 the administration will request a calendar revision for an early dismissal that day. The bank transition to the new bank had some bumps in the road but is currently going much smoother. The Ensemble Video report shows there is interest in the community for the videos and live streaming on the website.
