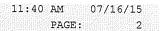

### SECTION 8. POST-EMPLOYMENT BENEFITS

#### 8.01 Voluntary Early Retirement Benefit Program

#### A. Eligibility

Teachers will be eligible for the early retirement benefit provided for in this Article if they a) declare in writing, to the Board of Education, their retirement intentions prior to February 1 of the calendar year in which they intend to retire from an employer contributing to the Wisconsin Retirement System, b) are WRS eligible for retirement and c) were hired prior to July 1, 2015.

#### **B.** Application and Limitation

Application for participation in the early retirement benefit provided for in this Article must be made by the teacher in writing and submitted to the School Board on or before February 1st of the last school year prior to retirement from an employer contributing to the Wisconsin Retirement System. No more than three (3) teachers shall be eligible to begin participation in the early retirement benefits provided for in this Article in the same year unless the School Board, at its sole discretion, approves a higher number. In the event there are more applicants than are eligible to participate, the most senior applicants, based on Colby School District experience, will be selected. If seniority is equal, the selection will be based on the order of receipt of the application.

#### C. Early Retirement Benefit Health Insurance

Upon retirement, for an eligible teacher whose application has been approved, the District will credit up to three thousand dollars for each year of service (\$3,000 x years of service at the Colby School District) to serve as a credit for the retiree for use in the payment of the premium for health insurance / medical expenses through the District until the teacher becomes entitled to Medicare.

1) Effective with the 2011-12 school year, each qualifying teacher shall have \$3,000, or such amount as proportional to the employment status of the teacher pursuant to his/her letter of appointment, designated in an HRA (Health Retirement Account) to be used for health insurance benefits upon retirement. The HRA may be funded or unfunded as determined by the District unless otherwise required by law.

2) The HRA benefit shall accrue to the teacher (subject to the terms of this provision) at the completion of the teacher's sixth full year of service in the Colby School District. Full year is defined as "full time" (1.0 FTE) and prorated based on FTE specified in the teacher's letter of appointment with the District.

3) In the event of death of the retiree, his or her spouse will be eligible to the above credits on the above basis as if the retiree was still living through the eligibility period reflected in this benefit offering had the employee survived.

4) There is no cash equivalency benefit available under this provision for the retiree or any surviving spouse.

#### D. Payment of Benefit

1) Upon Board approval of the retirement date, a monthly benefit is determined by dividing the total benefit credit by the number of months until the employee becomes entitled to Medicare eligibility.

2) Retired employees may use the HRA credit to receive reimbursement for qualifying health insurance through the District or to receive reimbursement of qualifying health insurance / medical expenses from a third party vendor selected by the district.

Retired employees who return to work in any position which offers health insurance shall have their benefit suspended until they no longer work in a position that is eligible for health insurance, subject to the terms for participation eligibility. Upon termination of any health insurance qualifying post retirement employment, monthly benefits with the Colby School District will be recalculated as described in Part II, Section 8, D(1).
 Any retiree who fails to provide notice to the District as provided in Part II, Section B within twelve (12) months of their retirement, shall forfeit this benefit.

5) The District reserves the right to modify this benefit offering at any time or cease it in its entirety including for retirees in pay status. Decisions made by the District in the interpretation and operation of this benefit offering shall be in its sole discretion and are final and binding. In the event of any review of a decision by a court of law, the reviewing tribunal shall give deference to the District's decision, confirming such decision, unless it is shown that the District acted in an arbitrary and capricious manner. The decision of the District on all issues under this offering shall be final.

#### 2015 WISCONSIN ACT 37

Senate Bill 121

Effective Date: July 3, 2015

#### CHANGES TO ELECTION LAWS AFFECTING WRITE-IN CANDIDATES AND SCHOOL DISTRICT REFERENDUM PROCEDURES

This new law makes numerous changes to the elections laws. The following changes are likely to be most relevant to school districts and school district officials:

- Existing law provides that if candidates have been certified to appear on the ballot for a particular office, then write-in votes may only be counted for candidates who have filed campaign registration statements. This new law establishes noon on the Friday immediately preceding the election as the deadline for a write-in candidate to file such a qualifying campaign registration statement. (*Note: In the scenario where no candidates have been certified to appear on the ballot, the law still requires all write-in votes to be counted, regardless of whether an individual receiving one or more write-in votes has filed a campaign registration statement.*)
- This new law provides that, following the adoption of a proper initial resolution to raise money by a bond issue that is subject to approval at a referendum, the school board shall direct the school district clerk to call a special election for the purpose of submitting the resolution to the electors for approval or rejection, or direct that the resolution be submitted at the next regularly-scheduled primary or election to be held not earlier than 70 days after the adoption of the resolution. Where this new law requires a 70-day period between the adoption of the initial resolution and the date of the referendum, prior law had specified a shorter 45-day period.
- As has long been the case for the polling places that are used for actual school board elections, this new law provides that (1) when a school district referendum is held in conjunction with a state, county, municipal, or judicial election, the polling places for the state, county, municipal, or judicial election shall be the polling places for the referendum and the municipal election hours shall apply, and (2) if no state, county, municipal, or judicial election is held on the day of a school district referendum, then the school board may select the polling places to be used. When the school board selects the polling places for a referendum, the school board must adhere to the same limitations that apply under existing law to closing a polling place for a school board election.

## Handbook, Part III Section 7.04

## 7.04 Food Service & Custodial Personnel – Extra Duty Pay

Food Service & Custodial personnel will receive an minimum hourly rate of \$20.00 per hour for cooking and/or food preparation, opening and closing building and custodial tasks above and beyond their regular scheduled hours when not district related. Pay rates for over 40 hours will be administered using Handbook Part III, Section 2.05 as a priority.

## Included for Reference

## 2.05 Additional Hours and Overtime - Approval and Assignment

- A. Approval: In order for an employee to work beyond his or her contract hours in any week, prior approval must be obtained from the immediate supervisor. Exceptional cases requiring overtime may be approved after the overtime is worked when all administrators/principals/immediate supervisors are unavailable and such pre-approval may cause harm to students, staff, the community or District property.
- B. Assignment: Non-emergency scheduled overtime assignments will be filled using volunteers first, with as much notice as possible, and if insufficient volunteers are found, the work will be assigned to a qualified employee(s) as determined by the District. If no one volunteers to perform the overtime, the District may assign the work on a rotating basis within the applicable job classification. Emergency overtime assignments shall be assigned at the discretion of the District.
- C. Pay Rate for Overtime: Time worked over forty (40) hours per week is paid at one and one-half (1.5) rate. Time over forty (40) hours per week does not include sick, vacation, or personal leave time. The reason for overtime must be indicated on the employee's time card. For the sole purpose of determining the appropriate pay period for the receipt of overtime pay, a week is defined as a pay period starting at 12:00 a.m. on Sunday and ending at 11:59 p.m. on Saturday.

## **BOARD MEMBER USE OF ELECTRONIC MAIL**

Electronic mail (e-mail) and computer transmissions by members of the Board of Education under some circumstances may be considered a meeting under the Wisconsin Open Meeting Law. Therefore, subject to applicable Board policies, e-mail will be used by the Board only for the purpose of communicating the following matters:

- 1. Messages between Board members or between Board members and employees that do not involve interactive exchange of opinions constituting discussion, deliberation, or decision-making on subjects within the realm of the Board's authority;
- 2. Possible meeting agenda items between the Superintendent of Schools and the Board President;
- 3. A Board meeting agenda or public record information concerning items on the agenda;
- 4. Requests for public record information pertaining to District operations;
- 5. Questions posed by the public to administrators requesting a District response.
- 6. Posting of all Committee and Board Meetings.

Under no circumstances shall Board members use e-mail to interactively communicate among themselves regarding Board business on subjects within the Board's realm of authority or which could be considered an invasion of privacy if the messages were to be monitored by another party.

Board members shall be provided with an e-mail account on the District file server. These accounts will be managed and archived by the District which will act as the legal custodian of such records on behalf of Board members as allowed by law. Official e-mail communications to Board members will be sent to the member's account on the District file server. Replies to e-mail messages by Board members are expected to be made via the District e-mail system, which allows the District to archive the return message.

Electronic Access: Board members will be provided with a device capable of accessing District Information, District email and web posts in order to provide them with timely communication. Board member devices will be upgraded (rotated) on a schedule that aligns with election cycles. Individual Board members will be provided the option of purchasing the device rotated out of Board use or returning it to the District. Purchase prices shall be determined by the Superintendent and shall be equal to purchasing a similar device at a market price.

## **OPERATING PROCEDURES**

#### MEETING POSTINGS

Meeting postings to include all District buildings visible from outside, and District banks designated by the School District of Colby. Any regular and special meeting agenda will be published in the designated paper and the District website.

#### **REGULAR MEETINGS**

The regular meeting of the Board of Education shall be held the third Monday of each month at <del>7:30</del> 7:00 PM or by a majority decision of the entire Board.

## SPECIAL MEETINGS

A special meeting of the Board will be held upon written request of any board member. Clerk (or President in Clerk's absence) will serve to the other members a written notice of the time and place of the meeting at least twenty-four (24) hours before the hour of the meeting. Such notice to each member shall be sent by email, messenger or by first class mail. No business will be transacted except that for which the meeting is called and which will be stated in the call.

#### PLACE OF MEETING

Meetings of the Board of Education shall be held in the Colby District Education Center (CDEC) unless a different place will be designated by resolution or in the notice of the meeting.

## START OF MEETING

The President or chairperson shall start all meetings promptly at the appointed hour.

## TRANSACTION OF BUSINESS

The Board of Education will transact all business at a legal meeting of the Board. No member shall have power to act in the name of the Board outside a Board meeting, without specific authorization by vote of the Board of Education.

## RULE OF ORDER

Meeting will be conducted in accordance with the most current edition of Roberts Rule of Order, except as otherwise provided by board policy or state statute.

## DISCUSSIONS

Discussions by any Board members shall be permitted on any subject on the agenda.

## **REMOTE PARTICIPATION**

The community expectation of elected officials is regular, physical attendance at the monthly meetings of the Board of Education. It is also acknowledged that attendance may conflict with other commitments of Board members; thus, remote (teleconference, video conferencing, etc.) participation is permitted given the following conditions:

- Remote participation is limited to no more than twice during a calendar year, unless approved by a majority vote of the entire Board at a previous meeting.
- Attendance shall be recorded in minutes as "remote attendance" and shall not be included for establishing a quorum.

- Voting is permitted during remote participation.
- Closed session requires physical attendance and remote participation is not permitted.

## LIMITATIONS ON DISCUSSIONS

The board may adopt rules to limit it's own discussions on any item. The President will stop any discussion which does not apply to the motion last made and may also stop the discussion of a matter if the Board has previously agreed to confine discussion to a definite period of time, and that period has been used up. Aside from such limitations, the President shall not interfere with discussion as long as a member wishes to speak.

## SELECTION OF HIGH SCHOOL STATE SPONSORED (HEAB) SCHOLARSHIP AND HONOR STUDENTS

The student having the highest GPA (grade point average) at the end of the seventh semester in high school will be selected to qualify as a scholarship recipient. The student must:

- a. Be enrolled as a full-time student through seven semesters.
- b. Attended Colby High School as a full-time student for four semesters (mid-point of sophomore year to mid-point of senior year).

In cases where there is a tie, based upon the highest cumulative G.P.A. at the end of the seventh semester, the following tiebreaker criteria will be used:

- a. The highest American College Test ACT composite score will determine who is selected the recipient. The ACT score must be on file in the guidance student services office by February 1<sup>st</sup>. The other student(s) tied with the highest G.P.A but not having the highest ACT composite score, will be designated runners up for consideration if for any reason the qualifier does not or cannot accept.
- b. If two or more students remain tied with the highest ACT composite score, additional tiebreakers may be applied. If still tied at ACT composite score declaring attendance at a Wisconsin College/University, then the number of AP classes; number of credits attempted; the composite PSAT scores; will be compared to break the tie will be applied. The additional tiebreakers shall be, in order:
  - The student who has the greatest number of combined Advanced Placement (AP) and post-secondary level courses scheduled throughout the student's four years of high school. If the course(s) are scheduled during the eighth semester, the classes(s) may not be dropped (unless a withdraw/fail is applied) once the HEAB Award has been named.
  - 2. The student who has the highest G.P.A. in Advanced Placement (AP) and postsecondary level courses.
  - 3. The student who has the greatest number of dual credit technical college level courses scheduled throughout the student's four years of high school. If the course(s) are scheduled during the eighth semester, the classes(s) may not be dropped (unless a withdraw/fail is applied) once the HEAB Award has been named.
  - 4. The student who has the greatest number of credits earned following the seventh semester.
  - 5. In the event that a tie still exists after steps 1, 2, 3 and 4, a draw from a new deck of cards shall be used to determine the winner. The highest draw, with 2 being the lowest and ace being the highest shall be declared the winner. Consecutive draws may be conducted until a winner is declared. The student whose last name is first alphabetically, will draw first. The Superintendent shall supervise the draw of the cards. Parents/Guardians of the students tied for the "Academic Excellence in High Education" will be invited to attend the card draw.

## HONOR STUDENTS

Colby High School will designate graduates with 3.6667 cumulative GPA as honor students.

## G.P.A.

A G.P.A. is determined for full-time students by using their accumulated points from grades received (A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, F=0), and dividing the total points by the number of credits taken. Rank in the class then evolves as students graduation class is compared to one another in a descending rank. GPA is used only to designate honor students for graduation and the HEAB scholarship recipient. Visiting students who are part of foreign exchange program, although they may meet the GPA, are not included in class rank.

## **GRADUATION CEREMONY PARTICIPATION**

Graduating seniors must have satisfactorily completed all obligations (fines, fees, assessments, assignments, tests, detentions, etc.) to be eligible to participate in the Commencement ceremony.

Students' participation in graduation exercises is optional. All graduating seniors are encouraged to participate in the commencement ceremony because it marks an important accomplishment in their lives. Since participation is optional, student that do participate are expected to conduct themselves in an orderly manner. The CHS administration will prepare and distribute regulations pertaining to commencement participation consistent with this policy.

To maintain the dignity and decorum of the graduation ceremony, only those students appropriately dressed for the occasion shall be permitted to participate. Students participating the graduation exercises must wear the cap and gown selected for the year. Students are required to pay a fee for the cap and gown. Since Commencement is a school-sponsored activity, all school rules of behavior apply. Anyone misbehaving during the exercises will be asked to leave.

- B. There shall be no smoking or other use of tobacco products or electronic cigarettes on any school grounds, playing field, or other outdoor area of the Colby School District.
- C. Exceptions may be granted, in advance, by the Superintendent for medically prescribed nicotine cessation products.
- D. Employees who repeatedly violate tobacco-free policies will be subject to discipline.

The District will publish a directory data notice annually in the district newsletter before the start of school. Parent, guardians, guardian ad litem and adult students have fourteen (14 days) to inform the school (in writing) that they do not want their directory data information released. All new enrollees, as well as parents, guardians, guardian ad litem and adult students will be notified of directory data information upon enrollment by each building office through the registration process. For transfer students, they will have fourteen (14 days) to inform the school (in writing) that they do not want their directory data information process.

The withheld directory data / information will not be released without prior written consent of the parent or adult student.

Authorization to withhold directory data will remain in effect until the start of the following school year, or until the parent or adult student notifies the district in writing of their intent to release this data.

Directory data / information relating to students no longer attending the district will not be released if the parent, guardians, guardian ad litem or eligible adult student has indicated that such information shall not be released in the year preceding the year in which the student has left the district.

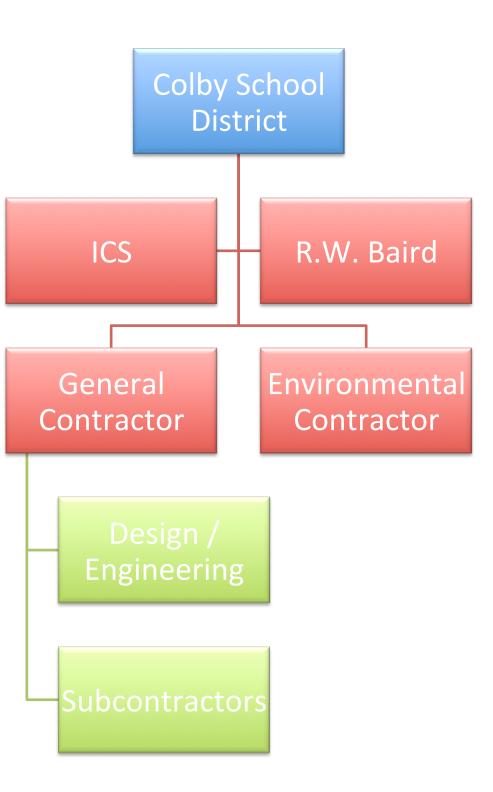

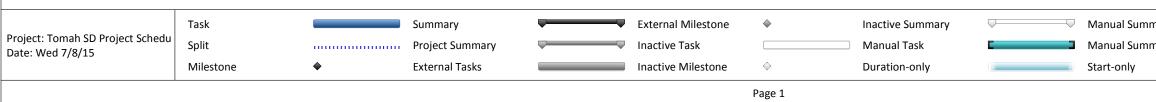
