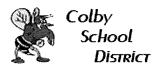

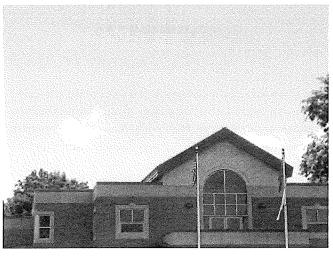

SHARED LMC DIRECTOR 66.0301 AGREEMENT Between THE SCHOOL DISTRICTS OF SPENCER AND COLBY 2016-17 SCHOOL YEAR

Pursuant to Wisconsin Statutes 66.0301, 120.25 and Department of Public Instruction Chapter PI14.02, the School Districts of Spencer and Colby agree to form a consortium to provide Library / Media Specialist services for staff and students in the Spencer and Colby School Districts.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION - PI-14.02(b): The School District of Colby will hire Nancy Becker, a DPI licensed LMC specialist and sub-contract that instructor's services to the School District of Spencer for 20% of her contract time during the school year and additional summer hours as needed. The School District of Colby will coordinate the scheduling of shared services with Ms. Becker and the Spencer School District administrator.

FISCAL AGENT – PI 14.02 (c) 1,2,3: The School District of Colby will be the fiscal agent and the instructor will operate in accordance with that district's operational policies, salary schedule, supervision and staff development. The School District of Colby will account for all employment responsibilities (teacher retirement, worker's compensation, and unemployment Insurance). As fiscal agent, The School District of Colby will establish and maintain records in accordance with the uniform accounting system prescribed by the Department of Public Instruction under §115.28 (13); file all required financial reports with the Department of Public Instruction.

BUDGET RECONCILIATION PI 14.02 (f) (h): Prorated costs to each participating school district will be based on Ms. Becker's 2015-16 contract and will be subject to change when her 2016-17 salary and benefits are determined. Based on a 20% contract the School district of Spencer would pay \$9544.00 for salary and \$6651.00 on benefits for a total cost of \$16,195.00. Summer hours will be negotiated and will be billed, according to time sheets, monthly to the Spencer School District. The School District of Colby will prepare a preliminary budget for the LMC specialist's costs and invoice 50% in January and 50% in May with actual and final reconciliation prior to June 30, 2017. In this way the proration of costs will be made on a basis which is fair and equitable to each participant.

The Spencer School district will be billed for travel and mileage between the Districts on an actual basis and reconciled on the final billing.

PROGRAM CONTACTS: Mr. Michael Endreas, Superintendent – Spencer School District, and Mr. Steven Kolden, Superintendent – Colby School District will be the instructor's direct supervisors as well as the responsible contact person for this instructional position in their respective districts.

ACCOUNTABILITY REPORTING: The instructor will be accountable to instructional program outcomes and the operational rules for each respective school system in which she instructs.

• Each home district providing transportation for their students will keep all eligible transportation aid. This aid is not part of the shared costs or expenses.

Pupil Membership (PI-14.02 (f)):

- The Colby, Abbotsford, Spencer, and Athens School Districts will claim respective attending students as residents and receive the equalization aid for them, subject to the annual reconciliation described in the following section.
- For the purpose of DPI Pupil Count reporting (PI 1563), each district will count their attendees of the Entrepreneurships Certificate as residents of the district.

Budget Reconciliation (PI-14.02 (f)(h)):

- The Colby School District will prepare a preliminary budget for costing. The Colby School District will invoice 50% at the end of first semester and 50% in May, with actual and final reconciliation prior to June 30, 2017.
- Each participating school district will pay a two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) commitment/participation fee.
- The balance of the program costs (beyond the total generated by the commitment/participation fee will be prorated based on the number of pupils from each school district participating in the cooperative program. The prorating of costs to each participating school district shall be made on a basis, which is fair and equitable to each participating school district, to all wages, benefits, supplies, textbooks, and established transportation costs.
- Enrollment to begin at semester, constitutes a full semester commitment in the per-pupil prorating of costs.

- The participating districts will share the costs of a .375 FTE instructor calculated between the School District of Colby Board of Education and the Colby Education Association.
- Budget variations shall require prior approval from each school board.

Part II SECTION 8. POST-EMPLOYMENT BENEFITS

8.01 Voluntary Early Retirement Benefit Program

A. Eligibility

Teachers will be eligible for the early retirement benefit provided for in this Article if a) they declare, in writing, to the Board of Education, their retirement intentions prior to February 1 of the calendar year in which they intend to retire from an employer contributing to the Wisconsin Retirement System, b) are WRS eligible for retirement and c) were hired prior to July 1, 2015 2013.

B. Application and Limitation

Application for participation in the early retirement benefit provided for in this Article must be made by the teacher in writing and submitted to the School Board on or before February 1st of the last school year prior to retirement from an employer contributing to the Wisconsin Retirement System. No more than three (3) teachers shall be eligible to begin participation in the early retirement benefits provided for in this Article in the same year unless the School Board, at its sole discretion, approves a higher number. In the event there are more applicants than are eligible to participate, the most senior applicants, based on Colby School District experience, will be selected. If seniority is equal, the selection will be based on the order of receipt of the application.

C. Early Retirement Benefit Health Insurance

For Staff hired prior to July 1, 1986

Upon retirement, for an eligible teacher whose application has been approved, the District will credit up to three thousand dollars for each year of service (\$3,000 x years of service at the Colby School District) for the retiree for a premium only health reimbursement account (HRA) until the teacher becomes entitled to Medicare.

- 1) Each qualifying teacher shall have \$3,000, or such amount as proportional to the employment status of the teacher pursuant to his/her letter of appointment, designated in an HRA (Health Retirement Account) to be used for insurance premiums upon retirement.
- 2) In the event of death of the retiree, his or her spouse will be eligible to the above credits on the above basis as if the retiree was still living through the eligibility period reflected in this benefit offering had the employee survived.
- 3) There is no cash equivalency benefit available under this provision for the retiree or any surviving spouse.

For Staff hired after July 1, 1986, yet prior to July 1, 1992

Upon retirement, for an eligible teacher whose application has been approved, the District will credit up to three thousand dollars for each year of service (\$3,000 x years of service at the Colby School District, up to a maximum of \$100,000) for the retiree for a premium only health reimbursement account (HRA) until the teacher becomes entitled to Medicare.

- 1) Each qualifying teacher shall have \$3,000, or such amount as proportional to the employment status of the teacher pursuant to his/her letter of appointment, designated in an HRA (Health Retirement Account) to be used for health insurance premiums upon retirement. The HRA may be funded or unfunded as determined by the District unless otherwise required by law.
- 2) In the event of death of the retiree, his or her spouse will be eligible to the above credits on the above basis as if the retiree was still living through the eligibility period reflected in this benefit offering had the employee survived.
- 3) There is no cash equivalency benefit available under this provision for the retiree or any surviving spouse.

For Staff hired after July 1, 1992, yet prior to July 1, 2004.

Upon retirement, for an eligible teacher whose application has been approved, the District will credit up to three thousand dollars for each year of service (\$3,000 x years of service at the Colby School District, up to a maximum of \$75,000) for the retiree for a premium only health reimbursement account (HRA) until the teacher becomes entitled to Medicare.

- 1) Each qualifying teacher shall have \$3,000, or such amount as proportional to the employment status of the teacher pursuant to his/her letter of appointment, designated in an HRA (Health Retirement Account) to be used for health insurance premiums upon retirement. The HRA may be funded or unfunded as determined by the District unless otherwise required by law.
- 2) In the event of death of the retiree, his or her spouse will be eligible to the above credits on the above basis as if the retiree was still living through the eligibility period reflected in this benefit offering had the employee survived.
- 3) There is no cash equivalency benefit available under this provision for the retiree or any surviving spouse.

For Staff hired after July 1, 2004, yet prior to July 1, 2009.

Upon retirement, for an eligible teacher whose application has been approved, the District will credit up to three thousand dollars for each year of service (\$3,000 x years of service at the Colby School District, up to a maximum of \$50,000) for the retiree for a premium only health reimbursement account (HRA) until the teacher becomes entitled to Medicare.

- 1) Each qualifying teacher shall have \$3,000, or such amount as proportional to the employment status of the teacher pursuant to his/her letter of appointment, designated in an HRA (Health Retirement Account) to be used for health insurance premiums upon retirement. The HRA may be funded or unfunded as determined by the District unless otherwise required by law.
- 2) In the event of death of the retiree, his or her spouse will be eligible to the above credits on the above basis as if the retiree was still living through the eligibility period reflected in this benefit offering had the employee survived.
- 3) There is no cash equivalency benefit available under this provision for the retiree or any surviving spouse.

For Staff hired after July 1, 2009, yet prior to July 1, 2015 2013.

Upon retirement, for an eligible teacher whose application has been approved, the District will credit up to three thousand dollars for each year of service (\$3,000 x years of service at the Colby School District, up to a maximum of \$25,000) for the retiree for a premium only health reimbursement account (HRA) until the teacher becomes entitled to Medicare.

- 1) Each qualifying teacher shall have \$3,000, or such amount as proportional to the employment status of the teacher pursuant to his/her letter of appointment, designated in an HRA (Health Retirement Account) to be used for health insurance premiums upon retirement. The HRA may be funded or unfunded as determined by the District unless otherwise required by law.
- 2) In the event of death of the retiree, his or her spouse will be eligible to the above credits on the above basis as if the retiree was still living through the eligibility period reflected in this benefit offering had the employee survived.
- 3) There is no cash equivalency benefit available under this provision for the retiree or any surviving spouse.

For Staff hired after July 1, 2013.

Upon employment, for an eligible teacher, the District will contribute \$500 annually (each year of service) to a premium only health reimbursement account (HRA) for utilization upon retirement from the Colby School District.

D. Payment of Benefit

1a) For Staff hired prior to July 1, 1986

Upon Board approval of the retirement date, a monthly benefit is determined by dividing the total benefit credit by the number of months until the employee becomes entitled to Medicare eligibility.

1b) For Staff hired prior to July 1, 2015 2013.

Upon Board approval of the retirement date, an annual benefit is determined by dividing the total benefit credit by 5.

- 2) Retired employees may use the HRA credit for premium only health reimbursement account from a third party vendor selected by the district.
- 3) Retired employees who return to work in any position which offers health insurance shall have their benefit suspended until they no longer work in a position that is eligible for health insurance, subject to the terms for participation eligibility. Upon termination of any health insurance qualifying post retirement employment, monthly benefits with the Colby School District will be recalculated as described in Part II, Section 8, D(1a) and D(1b).
- 4) Decisions made by the District in the interpretation and operation of this benefit offering shall be in its sole discretion and are final and binding. In the event of any review of a decision by a court of law, the reviewing tribunal shall give deference to the District's decision, confirming such decision, unless it is shown that the District acted in an arbitrary and capricious manner. The decision of the District on all issues under this offering shall be final.

Part IV SECTION 9. POST-EMPLOYMENT BENEFITS

9.01 Voluntary Early Retirement Benefit Program

A. Eligibility

Employees will be eligible for the early retirement benefit provided for in this Article if they declare, in writing, to the Board of Education, their retirement intentions no less than 90 days prior to the anticipated retirement date.

B. Application and Limitation

Application for participation in the early retirement benefit provided for in this Article must be made by the employee in writing and submitted to the School Board no less than 90 days prior to the anticipated retirement date. No more than three (3) employees shall be eligible to begin participation in the early retirement benefits provided for in this Article in the same year unless the School Board, at its sole discretion, approves a higher number. In the event there are more applicants than are eligible to participate, the most senior applicants, based on Colby School District experience, will be selected. If seniority is equal, the selection will be based on the order of receipt of the application.

C. Early Retirement Benefit Health Insurance

For Staff hired prior to July 1, 1986

Upon retirement, for an eligible teacher whose application has been approved, the District will credit up to three thousand dollars for each year of service (\$3,000 x years of service at the Colby School District) for the retiree for a premium only health reimbursement account (HRA) until the teacher becomes entitled to Medicare.

- 1) Each qualifying teacher shall have \$3,000, or such amount as proportional to the employment status of the teacher pursuant to his/her letter of appointment, designated in an HRA (Health Retirement Account) to be used for insurance premiums upon retirement.
- 2) In the event of death of the retiree, his or her spouse will be eligible to the above credits on the above basis as if the retiree was still living through the eligibility period reflected in this benefit offering had the employee survived.
- 3) There is no cash equivalency benefit available under this provision for the retiree or any surviving spouse.

For Staff hired after July 1, 1986, yet prior to July 1, 1992

Upon retirement, for an eligible teacher whose application has been approved, the District will credit up to three thousand dollars for each year of service (\$3,000 x years of service at the Colby School District, up to a maximum of \$100,000) for the retiree for a premium only health reimbursement account (HRA) until the teacher becomes entitled to Medicare.

- 1) Each qualifying teacher shall have \$3,000, or such amount as proportional to the employment status of the teacher pursuant to his/her letter of appointment, designated in an HRA (Health Retirement Account) to be used for health insurance premiums upon retirement. The HRA may be funded or unfunded as determined by the District unless otherwise required by law.
- 2) In the event of death of the retiree, his or her spouse will be eligible to the above credits on the above basis as if the retiree was still living through the eligibility period reflected in this benefit offering had the employee survived.
- 3) There is no cash equivalency benefit available under this provision for the retiree or any surviving spouse.

For Staff hired after July 1, 1992, yet prior to July 1, 2004.

Upon retirement, for an eligible teacher whose application has been approved, the District will credit up to three thousand dollars for each year of service (\$3,000 x years of service at the Colby School District, up to a maximum of \$75,000) for the retiree for a premium only health reimbursement account (HRA) until the teacher becomes entitled to Medicare.

1) Each qualifying teacher shall have \$3,000, or such amount as proportional to the employment status of the teacher pursuant to his/her letter of appointment, designated in an HRA (Health Retirement Account) to

be used for health insurance premiums upon retirement. The HRA may be funded or unfunded as determined by the District unless otherwise required by law.

- 2) In the event of death of the retiree, his or her spouse will be eligible to the above credits on the above basis as if the retiree was still living through the eligibility period reflected in this benefit offering had the employee survived.
- 3) There is no cash equivalency benefit available under this provision for the retiree or any surviving spouse.

For Staff hired after July 1, 2004, yet prior to July 1, 2009.

Upon retirement, for an eligible teacher whose application has been approved, the District will credit up to three thousand dollars for each year of service (\$3,000 x years of service at the Colby School District, up to a maximum of \$50,000) for the retiree for a premium only health reimbursement account (HRA) until the teacher becomes entitled to Medicare.

- 1) Each qualifying teacher shall have \$3,000, or such amount as proportional to the employment status of the teacher pursuant to his/her letter of appointment, designated in an HRA (Health Retirement Account) to be used for health insurance premiums upon retirement. The HRA may be funded or unfunded as determined by the District unless otherwise required by law.
- 2) In the event of death of the retiree, his or her spouse will be eligible to the above credits on the above basis as if the retiree was still living through the eligibility period reflected in this benefit offering had the employee survived.
- 3) There is no cash equivalency benefit available under this provision for the retiree or any surviving spouse.

For Staff hired after July 1, 2009, yet prior to July 1, 2013.

Upon retirement, for an eligible teacher whose application has been approved, the District will credit up to three thousand dollars for each year of service (\$3,000 x years of service at the Colby School District, up to a maximum of \$25,000) for the retiree for a premium only health reimbursement account (HRA) until the teacher becomes entitled to Medicare.

- 1) Each qualifying teacher shall have \$3,000, or such amount as proportional to the employment status of the teacher pursuant to his/her letter of appointment, designated in an HRA (Health Retirement Account) to be used for health insurance premiums upon retirement. The HRA may be funded or unfunded as determined by the District unless otherwise required by law.
- 2) In the event of death of the retiree, his or her spouse will be eligible to the above credits on the above basis as if the retiree was still living through the eligibility period reflected in this benefit offering had the employee survived.
- 3) There is no cash equivalency benefit available under this provision for the retiree or any surviving spouse.

For Staff hired after July 1, 2013.

Upon employment, for an eligible teacher, the District will contribute \$500 annually (each year of service) to a premium only health reimbursement account (HRA) for utilization upon retirement from the Colby School District.

D. Payment of Benefit

1a) For Staff hired prior to July 1, 1986

Upon Board approval of the retirement date, a monthly benefit is determined by dividing the total benefit credit by the number of months until the employee becomes entitled to Medicare eligibility.

1b) For Staff hired prior to July 1, 2013.

Upon Board approval of the retirement date, an annual benefit is determined by dividing the total benefit credit by 5.

- 2) Retired employees may use the HRA credit for premium only health reimbursement account from a third party vendor selected by the district.
- 3) Retired employees who return to work in any position which offers health insurance shall have their benefit suspended until they no longer work in a position that is eligible for health insurance, subject to the terms for participation eligibility. Upon termination of any health insurance qualifying post retirement employment, monthly benefits with the Colby School District will be recalculated as described in Part II, Section 8, D(1a) and D(1b).
- 4) Decisions made by the District in the interpretation and operation of this benefit offering shall be in its sole discretion and are final and binding. In the event of any review of a decision by a court of law, the reviewing tribunal shall give deference to the District's decision, confirming such decision, unless it is shown that the District acted in an arbitrary and capricious manner. The decision of the District on all issues under this offering shall be final.

Resolution Authorizing Issuance Of Individual Procurement Cards

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the School District of Colby, #1162, has the authority to enter into an agreement with the Bank of Montreal for purchasing cards;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education/Trustees of the School District of Colby, #1162,

that the President/Treasurer/Clerk are authorized to enter into an Agreement with the Bank of Montreal to secure Procurement Cards for each authorized employee of the school district under such terms and conditions as approved by the Board.

The Board of Education authorizes the Superintendent/District Bookkeeper to execute a p-Card program agreement on its behalf.
