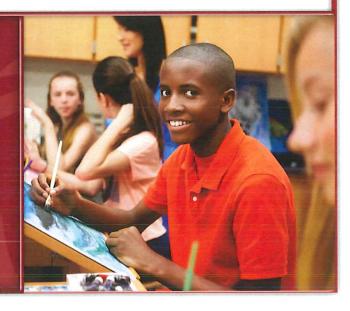

But the legal requirements are just one component of an effective meeting – the human variable needs to be addressed as well.

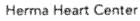

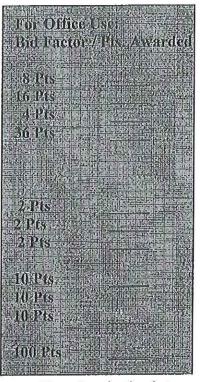

August 2017 – Bus Route Concerns

Board Policy 751 states "The supervision, control, and assignment of routes is to be done by the superintendent or his designated agent."

We put written Guidelines in place as Administrative Procedure to inform others of how administration will implement School Board policy in a consistent manner.

Based upon the feedback I've received, I see five potential options for the Board to respond to parent concerns. To be consistent for all we serve, the process of addressing parent concerns would be to address this through administrative procedures that are already in place.

- 1) Request Administration to rewrite administrative procedures shortening the distance we require students to walk to meet a bus stop.
 - This is possible. We reduce the walking distance requirement in administrative procedures.
 - This would then, in turn, require us to add multiple stops in the City of Colby, the Village of Unity and at least one stop in Riplinger.
- 2) Request / Consider designating Hiline as a "hazardous road". This would allow a pick up on Hiline, or nearby to address student safety as indicated in administrative procedure.
 - While this is an option, I don't believe it's practical or likely.
 - In order to designate a road as hazardous, we request that the Sheriff's Department make that designation for us. We do this to provide consistency in this designation as different people view "dangerous" in different capacities.
- 3) Consider Owner Arm's Length Childcare a licensed day care center.
 - Administrative procedures already permit special consideration for "Licensed Daycares".
- 4) Create a "rural stop" at the corner of Hiline and Viking.
 - This is possible; we can bring a bus into Dorchester south on Hiline in the morning. This would have minimal impact on AM ride time.
 - Rural routes utilize a "First On First Off" routing to make ride time as equitable as possible for the students. The PM routes would not leave Dorchester on Hiline, thus the stop at Hiline would be when the bus returns to Dorchester. This would add significant ride time to students at this stop.
- 5) Do Nothing
 - Recognizing that nothing is perfect, we CAN hear parent concerns and take no action.

AMENDMENT AND RESTATEMENT OF THE COLBY SCHOOL DISTRICT EMPLOYEES SAVINGS PLAN (403(b) PLAN)

WHEREAS, the District desires to amend and restate the Plan effective September 1, 2017; and

WHEREAS, that it is the intention of the District that the Plan program will conform with all federal and state statutory and regulatory requirements applicable to tax sheltered annuity plans under Section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, except that the Plan shall not be subject to the requirements of Title I of ERISA because the Plan is exempt from such requirements.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Plan shall be and hereby is amended and restated effective September 1, 2017 in the form attached hereto.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the officers of the District, or any one or more of them, be, and they hereby are, authorized and directed to take all such actions and to execute all such instruments and documents as the officers in their sole discretion deem advisable, appropriate, and necessary to carry out the intent and to accomplish the purpose of the foregoing resolutions.

Selection and scheduling of lifeguards shall be based on a priority order utilizing the following criteria (similar to Part III, Section 3.03 (C) 2d).

- 1. Date of hire.
- 2. When date of hire is the same, the lifeguard with greater certifications.
- 3. When hire date and certifications are the equal, the lifeguard with the greatest length of service.
- ** Wage Based on **required** Education/Licensure in content instructing. Wage may be adjusted to align with class enrollment.

*** Must meet qualifications as specified in the job description
