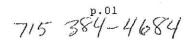

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REGULAR MEETING MINUTES BOARD OF EDUCATION – SCHOOL DISTRICT OF COLBY MONDAY, JULY 18, 2011 COLBY DISTRICT/EDUCATION CENTER

The Regular School Board Meeting on July 18, 2011, was called to order at 7:30 p.m. in the Colby District Education Center by Board President, Bill Tesmer. Members present were Dennis Engel, Eric Elmhorst, Ed Haas, Bill Tesmer and Cheryl Ploeckelman. Donna Krueger and Todd Schmidt were absent. Also present were Superintendent Steven Kolden and Chris Thieme.

The meeting notice was posted according to the requirements of the open meeting law.

Dr. Kolden distributed Updated Board of Education Contact Information. Selected staff are screening the high school principal applications. Interviews are scheduled for Tuesday and Thursday this week. After a selection is made reference checks will be conducted. We are jointly submitting a plan that accomplishes some significant financial savings for the district from 2010-11. We have increased employee contributions for insurance. We have shifted from a district front loaded HSA to an HRA (Health Reimbursement Arrangement) with employee front loaded deductibles. We believe this is the best health & dental plan option to meet the districts needs to reduce budgets and yet provide employees the best coverage possible for themselves and their families.

REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS –MILK Due: August 12, 2011

The School District of Colby will receive sealed proposals until August 12, 2011 for the furnishing and delivering of milk to all school buildings in the Colby School District according to the specifications outlined below:

- 1. Please quote the delivered price, tax exempt, on the following dairy products to be delivered to individual sites in the school district for the proposal period August 22, 2011 and ending August 21, 2012. Prices should be quoted on half-pints of Grade A Fat Free or Skim Milk, Grade A 1% milk and Grade A Skim Chocolate milk. The district uses approximately 250,000 ½ pint cartons of milk during the school year. Also, please include a proposal for 4-5# cottage cheese, 4-5# sour cream and four one-gallon jugs of 2% milk per delivery.
- 2. Deliveries shall be made a minimum of twice a week unless otherwise authorized by the Food Service Director. Delivery times for all schools shall be submitted to the Food Service Director to assure deliveries are compatible with building schedules. Deliveries are to be made when District staff can accept delivery. Preferred delivery days are Monday and Thursday, however, the District will negotiate if vendor is unable to provide service on those days.
- 3. The District reserves the right to process background checks on any individual who has access to the school buildings on a regular basis when children are present. Personnel information necessary to process background checks will be requested upon bid award. Vendor awarded contract will inform the Food Service Director when staff leaves company employment so access can be discontinued.
- 4. Only the Colby School District Food Service Director or the District Comptroller are authorized to order milk products from this proposal. All other school personnel must obtain a separate purchase order to buy products from the dairy.
- 5. All products delivered to the schools shall have a minimum 10 days of shelf life.
- 6. All milk shall be held and transported at temperatures between 33 and 40 degrees Fahrenheit. Any milk received outside of this temperature range may be refused. Product is to be placed in refrigerated area. Product left outside or in a non-refrigerated area will be returned to the dairy for full credit.
- 7. The only proposals that will be considered are those signed by a dairy holding a valid license and permit. All milk shall be Grade A pasteurized, homogenized and shall conform to all laws and regulations of the State of Wisconsin as administered by the Wisconsin Division of Health.
- 8. Half-pint milk shall be packaged in gable top cartons.
- 9. Delivery tickets shall be furnished with deliveries of milk. Bills for milk are to be sent to the Colby District Education Center no later than the Friday before the second Tuesday of the month. The deadline for the statements at the end of the school year shall be June 15, 2012. The billing will itemize the daily deliveries. Invoices should be sent to:

- 10. Respondent shall pick up (and credit to the School District) any unused milk at all schools during scheduled breaks and at the end of the school year.
- 11. Any undated milk will be returned to the dairy and replaced for full credit.
- 12. Delivery driver will assist and work with school staff to assure proper rotation and stocking of product.
- 13. Awardee shall provide reports detailing usage for each school receiving deliveries.
- 14. The successful bidder will furnish any needed refrigeration for milk in the elementary school. Please specify the type of cooler being furnished.
- 15. In the event an escalator clause is included, it shall be based on the July Federal Milk Order from the Central Milk Producers. Any other clauses based on value of butterfat will also be evaluated. All else being equal, the content of the escalator clause(s) will be used to determine the price structure which offers the best value for the District.
- 16. Respondents shall submit a single price for each type of milk and product requested.
- 17. Actual order quantities may vary from the amounts indicated in this request for proposals. Vendor will provide the District with a usage report by school and by product to the District upon request.
- 18. Vendor shall provide milk cases at no cost.
- 19. Vendor will provide details of vending machine program, rebates, credits, etc.
- 20. Each respondent shall include a certification statement verifying that neither it nor any of its principals have been proposed for debarment, debarred or suspended by a Federal agency.
- 21. To comply with Federal requirements, respondent shall provide evidence of compliance with Executive Order 11246, entitled, "Equal Employment Opportunity."
- 22. Products obtained under contract may be tested by state weights and measures representatives and the remedies that the Colby School District Food Service Program will exercise when products fail to meet either contract or label specifications may include:
 - A. Cash restitution or in-kind replacement, at the Colby School District Food Service Program's discretion, for the total lot which failed;
 - B. Payment for the value of all meals that the Colby School District Food Service Program served which failed to contain the minimum quantities and components required of a reimbursable meal under the Child Nutrition Programs because the supplier provided short-weighted products;
 - C. The time frames for providing restitution and payments to the Colby School District Food Service Program;
 - D. A notice that repeated instances of products failing to contain required quantities is a material breach of the contract which may result in contract termination for cause; and
 - E. A requirement that all costs resulting from termination for cause may be borne by the contractor.

- 23. Should the awarded vendor wish to terminate this contract, the vendor agrees to provide the Colby School District, in writing, by certified mail, sixty (60) calendar days notice of termination of contract. The Colby Board of Education reserves the right to accept or reject any and/or all quotations, to accept single or combined proposals of items, to waive any formalities in bidding and to award contract to the bidder who, in the judgment of the Board of Education, will best serve the interest of said Board of Education.

Water Availability during National School Lunch Program Meal Service and

Nutrition Requirements for Fluid Milk

PLEASE forward this important information to all persons with Child Nutrition Program responsibilities.

The Healthy Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010 has made modifications to the fluid milk requirement in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and School Breakfast Program (SBP) and introduced a new provision regarding water availability during lunch meal service. Each of these changes is outlined below and must be implemented by the designated effective date highlighted within each section.

Water Availability

On April 12, 2011, the USDA issued memo SP 28-2011: Water Availability During National School Lunch Program Meal Service, requiring schools participating in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) to make potable water available to children, without restriction and at no charge, in the place where lunch meals are served or immediately adjacent to the meal service area. Schools are required to comply with this requirement no later than the beginning of School Year 2011-2012. Suggested options for schools to implement this requirement include:

- Water pitchers and cups on lunch tables;
- A water fountain in the cafeteria or immediately adjacent to the cafeteria; or
- A faucet that allows students to fill their own bottles or cups with drinking water.

Potable water availability is a requirement but it is not considered part of a reimbursable meal and students are not required to take it. However, reasonable costs associated with providing potable water would be an allowable cost to the non-profit food service account. Reasonable costs would not include capital expenditures for building upgrades to plumbing and other similar construction expenses.

The USDA is planning to publish a Questions and Answers (Q&A) document to assist with interpretation of this new policy, but at this time, it has not yet been released. In the meantime, you may access SP 28-2011 on the Department of Public Instruction's (DPI) School Nutrition Team's Child Nutrition Reauthorization (CNR) webpage at http://dpi.wi.gov/fns/cnrsnp.html, under the

"Water Availability" heading. Once released, the Q&A will be added to this section on the CNR webpage.

Lastly, FNS plans to issue the proposed rule regarding water availability in conjunction with the proposed nutrition standards for all foods sold in schools, with an expected release date of December 2011 or January 2012.

Nutrition Requirements for Fluid Milk

In addition to the new provision on water availability, the USDA has published updated nutritional requirements for milk served as part of the NSLP and SBP. USDA Memo SP 29-2011: Nutrition Requirements for Fluid Milk, issued on April 14, 2011, requires that a variety of fluid milk be served, consistent with the most recent Dietary Guidelines for Americans. The 2010 Dietary Guidelines recommend that persons over age two should consume fat-free or low-fat (1%) fluid milk. School Food Authorities (SFAs) must offer at least two choices from the following list:

- Fat-free milk,
- Low-fat (1%) milk,
- Fat-free or low-fat lactose reduced milk,
- Fat-free or low-fat lactose-free milk,
- Fat-free or low-fat buttermilk, or
- Fat-free or low-fat acidified milk.

All products above must be pasteurized fluid milk that meets State and local standards.

Until an implementation rule is in effect for the Nutrition Standards in the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs (which will address fat content and flavored milk), SFAs must offer plain or flavored low-fat and fat-free milk to meet the variety requirements listed above. For example, offering a choice of chocolate skim and white skim milk would meet the variety requirement. SP 29-2011 is also available on the Department of Public Instruction's School Nutrition Team's Child Nutrition Reauthorization webpage at http://dpi.wi.gov/fns/cnrsnp.html, under the "Milk" heading.

We understand that many milk contracts are already in place for School Year 2011-12. However, the USDA is requiring School Food Authorities to alter their current vendor agreements to comply with this requirement beginning in School Year 2011-12.

Policies, procedures, and practices related to the methods, practices, curriculum and materials used in counseling.

1. What are the district's policies and practices regarding multiple perspectives in and through counseling?

The Colby School District does not have a separate BOE policy regarding counseling; however, it has been and remains practice that all policies regarding pupil nondiscrimination apply to the area of counseling and the school wide counseling model.

- 2. The following questions pertain to the type of training counselors have received:
 - a. How have they been trained to recognize bias or stereotypes? WSCA, Wisconsin School Counselors Association annual conferences. Barbra Bitters-DPI training in 2011
 - How have they been trained to recognize and present multiple perspectives in and through counseling? WSCA, Wisconsin School Counselors Association annual conferences. Barbra Bitters-DPI training in 2011
 - c. How often has the above training occurred? Was the training required or optional? Roughly every other year, the training is encouraged but optional.
 - d. How effective was the training in improving counseling? The training was felt to impact counselors and their counseling methods in a positive way.
- 3. How does the district ensure that bias and stereotyping are absent from counseling materials and techniques.

All counseling materials and techniques are reviewed by the pupil services team annually as new materials come into the district and new techniques are implemented by the district.

4. Does the district provide culturally and linguistically accessible support services to students and families?

Yes, through the comprehensive school counseling model, use of translators, ELL programming, and family support systems.

5. Does academic planning and support services assist students in closing the achievement gap? How are counseling or student services aligned with mainstream curriculum, instruction and assessment?

Yes, Counseling services are aligned with mainstream curriculum and teachers are encouraged to carry over lessons in their own rooms to ensure that students are grasping concepts addressed through the comprehensive counseling model. Currently students are informally assessed on knowledge of these concepts.

6. What are your recommendations for improvement? How will these recommendations be implemented?

Counselors should be provided with additional paid time for reviewing materials, evaluating programs, and data retreats to ensure current responses are in place for our changing student population. In addition, a new statement of nondiscrimination should be added to the student agendas, course description book at the high school, comprehensive guidance model, and our policies and procedures.

Policies, procedures, and practices related to the participation trends and patterns and school district support of athletic, extracurricular, and recreational activities.

Are some groups underrepresented in athletic programs and activities?

Yes and No. There are enough athletic programs and co-curricular opportunities for all students to be involved in to meet the diverse needs and interests (Athletics, Show Choir, SADD, FCCLA, Math League, NHS, Skills-VICA, FFA, Water Ballet, Spanish Club, Chess Club, Solo Ensembles, Student Council, Forensics, FBLA, Dance, NHS, etc). There are though an increasing number of Hispanics students moving into the district and soccer may be one offering that needs serious consideration.

2. Are effective procedures in place to track participation in athletic programs and activities by race, sex, disability, and national origin?

There are no yearly procedures in place tracking participation other than knowing how many students are out for each sport.

- 3. The following questions pertain to interscholastic athletic opportunities for male and female students.
 - a. Are interscholastic athletic opportunities for males and females provided in numbers substantially proportionate to their respective enrollments in the district?
 - Athletic opportunities are proportionate and fair.
 - Girls: volleyball, swimming, cross country, basketball, track and field, softball
 - Boys: football, cross country, basketball, wrestling, track and field, baseball
 - Are the opportunities comparable in scope and type?
 Athletic programs are comparable.
- 4. Review the district's separate interscholastic athletic programs for males and females. Is equitable support provided in the following areas?
 - a. Coaching and other staff salaries.
 - Coaching salaries are consistent and fair for each sport.
 - b. Provision of uniforms, equipment and supplies.
 - Uniforms, equipment and supplies are provided for each sport through yearly budgeting and on a as needed basis.
 - c. Scheduling of games and practice times.
 - Games are scheduled according to WIAA rules and procedures. Furthermore, the Activities Director meets with coaches to talk about scheduling. Practice times are allotted for each sport and in the case of basketball and softball/baseball, the coach's meet to distribute practice time equitably.
 - d. Provision of transportation.
 - All sports have equitable transportation at the expense of the district.
 - e. Opportunity to receive experienced coaching, academic tutoring, medical, or other types of services. The school district tries to hire the best coach's that are interested in the job. Medical services are available for all sports thru the Marshfield Clinic Athletic Trainer that comes on site at least two days a week. The trainer also splits her time between various sporting events (games, meets, matches, etc).

- f. Access to locker rooms, practice and competitive facilities.

 There are two locker rooms available for boys and two locker rooms available for girls. Practice times are allotted for each sport and in the case of basketball and softball/baseball, the coach's meet to distribute practice time equitably. Facilities are well maintained for all sports.
- Publicity efforts.
 A sports calendar is distributed to local businesses with all sports games listed. Each coach is responsibility for writing the local newspaper pre-season and after all competitive events.
- Availability of pep band, cheerleaders, pom pon, etc.
 The pep band plays at football games and girls/boys basketball games. Colby does not have cheerleaders and pom pon team dances at football and girls/boys basketball games.
- 5. Are school mascots, team names, and logos free from bias and stereotyping? The mascot for Colby is a Hornet so it is free from bias, etc.
- 6. Does attendance at athletic events reflect the diversity of the students in the school? Athletic events are typically well attended (although it does depend on a winning season or not/weather/etc). Boy events are well attended by females and girl events are well attended by boys.
- 7. Do coaches receive training in recognizing diverse communication styles and in recognizing and neutralizing bias or stereotyping?
 Coaches do not receive any specific training unless what they are taught when receiving their teaching license or when completing the WIAA coach's education requirements for those who don't hold a teaching license.
- 8. Do coaches receive training to prevent hazing and harassment of, and by, athletes? Coaches do not receive any specific training unless what they are taught when receiving their teaching license or when completing the WIAA coach's education requirements for those who don't hold a teaching license. Coaches are made aware by the Activities Director that allowing hazing or harassment is not acceptable in any form.
- 9. Does the selection of specific sports and levels of competition accommodate the interests and abilities of: members of both sexes, students with special needs, students with limited-English proficiency, or diverse racial/ethnic groups?
 - All sports are looked at annually and the number of athletes in each sports. Colby feels that sports are adequately sponsored for boys and girls. Colby also offers Special Olympics in a number of sports like bowling, basketball, track and field. The one area that needs consideration for the future will be for the Hispanic population and soccer perhaps.
- 10. Has the district periodically conducted surveys in order to determine whether athletic interests are being met by the current athletic program?
 - The district has not conducted surveys. Each school year, the High School holds meetings for athletic sign-ups in each sport a few months in advance of the season starting. The school board at various times throughout the year discusses sports participation.
- 11. Are special accommodations made for students with disabilities?

 The school district has a Special Olympics program. Students with disabilities are allowed on sports teams with certain restrictions and understandings, depending on the sport.
- 12. Review data of participation in extracurricular and recreational activities for at least the past three years.
 - To what extent do participation rates in extracurricular and other recreational activities reflect the overall composition of the student population by race, gender, national origin or disability?
 Unsure

13. Are effective procedures in place to track participation, by group, in extracurricular and recreational activities?

There are no set procedures or policies in place to track this type of information.

14. Are activities provided to meet the expressed interests of all groups?

The School District of Colby provides a great deal of activities to meet the needs of the diverse population. The activities vary from fun nights, authors, book sales, Parent Clubs, sports, clubs, dances, etc.

- 15. Are students and parents/guardians encouraged to organize extracurricular activities or clubs that target their needs as members of a protected class? Has the district surveyed students, staff, and parents/guardians to determine what these needs or interests are?
 - There are a few organizations that organize certain activities to meet the members of a protected class like Special Olympics, overnight stays in a house to learn basic living skills, etc.
- 16. Are special accommodations made for children with disabilities?

 Yes
- 17. Is there a fair process by which all groups seeking school-approved status can apply? Are all groups that follow the process and meet criteria approved?
 Unsure
- 18. What strategies has the district used to encourage participation by underrepresented groups? Have these strategies been effective?
 - The district has had several meaningful discussions about meeting the needs even more of the Hispanic population. Some of the discussion has focused on time, money, resources and qualified individuals who are willing to help participation and interest.
- 19. How often and in what forms are the districts nondiscrimination policies and practices regarding athletic, extracurricular, recreational and other activities communicated to students and parents/guardians? How might this communication be improved?
 - Policies are placed in newsletters, student handbooks, the co-curricular code, etc. Communication could be improved by putting the above mentioned in Spanish.
- 20. Is there a permanent process in place for ensuring that all public information regarding athletic, extracurricular and recreational activities is inclusive and free of bias, stereotyping and discrimination, including language and visuals? Public information includes press releases, brochures; outreach/recruiting materials, posters, public service announcements, et cetera.
 - There is no permanent process involved.
- 21. Is information regarding athletic, extracurricular, recreational, and other activities published in other languages in addition to English? Is the information available in Braille or audio versions? Information is not published other than English.
- 22. What are your recommendations for increasing participation of underrepresented groups in athletics, extracurricular, and recreational activities? What are your recommendations for ensuring that equitable support is provided in the district's athletic programs? How will these recommendations be implemented?
 - The one recommendation would be to look at adding soccer to the athletic program. Another recommendation would be to include a Spanish version of the athletic schedules that are printed and distributed to local businesses.

Policies, procedures, and practices related to the participation trends and patterns awarding scholarships and other forms of recognition.

- 1. Review data and information on award recipients and applicants for at least the past three years. Identify trends and patterns.
 - a. To what extent do the applications for scholarships and other awards reflect the overall composition of the student population by race, sex, national origin, or disability?
 The School District of Colby as a whole does a very good job at recognition the majority of the student body in some way or another (Student of the Week, Student of the Month, recognition assemblies, etc) and all students have an equal opportunity. Students who participate in certain activities receive certain awards or letters based on the qualifications set forth by the coach or advisor.
 - b. To what extent do the number and amount of scholarships and other awards reflect the overall composition of the student population by race, sex, national origin, or disability?
 The Colby Elementary and Middle School are well represented. Scholarships in the High School need to be earned by meeting the criteria set forth by the scholarship.
 - c. What criteria does the district use in order to ensure or promote a representative distribution? What other efforts does the district undertake to ensure or promote a representative distribution? Each building decides how they are going to distribute or promote certain awards or scholarships. The Elementary and Middle School try to recognize as many individuals as possible throughout the school year and all students can receive these honors.
- 2. What procedures are in place to track and analyze applications for and awarding of scholarships and other forms of recognition by protected class status? Do these procedures need to be updated, broadened or otherwise modified to ensure a representative distribution?
 There are no set procedures in place for tracking or analyzing. Special Olympics for example are represented and they have certain sports they partake in and the local Booster Club even recognizes them and gives them money for their sport like they do all Colby High School sports.
- 3. What criteria are used in selecting recipients? Do they contain bias or stereotyping that may exclude some groups?
 - The criterion that is used is determined by the scholarship itself and the school doesn't have a say in that. Scholarship information comes to the school and the counselor distributes that information for all students. Whether a student applies for a scholarship is up to them and some scholarship criterion are specifically mentioned so not every student has the ability to apply (Catholic, CEA member, sport specific).
- 4. To what extent do students assisted by school officials for scholarships and other awards reflect the overall composition of the student population by race, sex, national origin and disability? School officials are willing to help any student that is interested in applying for scholarships. Scholarships are open equally to all but some scholarships certain requirements (athletic, female, football, CEA member, etc). Scholarships are equal to all but they are not received equally. The Hispanic population in general doesn't apply for many of the scholarships because a large number of students don't go on to post secondary schooling. Many of the Hispanics are undocumented citizens so it is more difficult to go on to schooling. The School District of Colby doesn't promote any scholarship more than any other, as the scholarships come in, the school lets students know.
- 5. What criteria does the district undertake to ensure or promote a representative distribution? What other efforts does the district undertake to ensure or promote a representative distribution?

- There is no set criteria ensuring a representative distribution. Most scholarships have certain criteria that is deemed by the organization or individual. The School District of Colby could place the Notice of Non-Discrimination policy on all scholarships.
- 6. What annual procedures are in place to track and analyze the role of school officials in assisting students? Do these procedures need to be updated, broadened or otherwise modified to ensure a representative distribution?
 - The School District of Colby doesn't analyze or track scholarships. As the scholarships come in, they are publicized to all students.
- 7. How often, and in what settings, are staff, students and parents/guardians made aware of the district's nondiscrimination policies in the awarding of scholarships and other forms of recognition?
 The School District of Colby places the Notice of Non-Discrimination policy in the district newsletter, co-curricular code, student handbooks/agendas.
- 8. How has the district involved parents and community members from diverse backgrounds in developing effective strategies to publicize available awards and explain how to pursue these opportunities? The district has not involved parents or community members in developing effective strategies. The counselor does meet with all upcoming seniors and their parents though to discuss credits, post secondary schooling, scholarships, etc.
- 9. Is there an effective process in place for ensuring that all public information regarding scholarships and other forms of recognition are inclusive and free of bias, stereotyping and discrimination, including language and visuals? Public information includes press releases, brochures, announcements, et cetera. There is no process in place.
- 10. Does the disseminated information clearly explain the scholarship application process? Is the information published in other languages in addition to English? Is the information available in Braille, video, or audio versions?
 - Yes, all scholarships clearly explain what is needed on the application. The information is only published in English.
- 11. What are your recommendations for increasing distribution of scholarships and other awards to underrepresented groups? How will these recommendations be implemented? The only recommendation that has been discussed is talking to local businesses who hire Hispanic workers to see if they would be willing to offer scholarships to meet the needs of the Hispanic population. Furthermore, we are a small enough High School and the counselor does try to target or make contact with certain students who they feel would benefit from certain scholarships.
