The School District of Colby is a Pre K-12 public school system located in rural, Central Wisconsin. District residents are split between three communities comprised of Colby, Dorchester and Unity. These communities lie within the two counties of Marathon and Clark. The total population of these three small towns is approximately 3000. The school district consists of about 921 students. Approximately 30% of those in attendance are of a minority status. The income level in the area is well below the state personal income average. Forty-nine percent of Colby School District students are eligible for free and reduced lunch.

ACADEMIC INFORMATION

Students at Colby High School are required to complete 24 academic credits to graduate. Minimum requirements include four (4) credits of English (including a speech/communications course), three and one-half (3 1/2) credits of social studies, three (3) credits of mathematics, three (3) credits of science, one and one-half (1 1/2) credits of physical education and one-half (1/2) credit of health. Students are required to take a minimum of 8.5 credits worth of electives.
