

What Can You Do To Help Your Child Stay On The Path To Positive Behavior?

- * Ask your child each day about his/her day at school.
- * Make sure your child is ready every day. Ensure a good night's sleep.
- * Provide a quiet time and space for your child to do homework quietly.
- * Communicate frequently with your child's teacher.
- * Encourage your child to use appropriate language and tone.
- * Practice positive phrases with your child such as: "Thank You," "Excuse Me," and "I'm Sorry."
- * Be a visible part of your child's school day. Attend PTC meetings, and other school activities as your schedule allows.

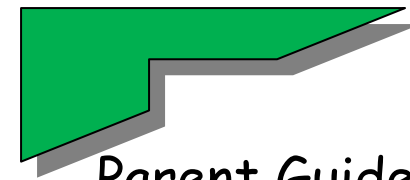

What is Positive Behavior Interventions & Supports?

P.B.I.S. (Positive Behavior Intervention & Supports) is a school-wide approach to discipline, establishing expectations, and developing a process to create a safe and more effective school.

P.B.I.S. is a systems approach to enhancing the capacity of a school to educate all children by developing research-based, school wide, and classroom discipline systems.

The process focuses on improving a school's ability to teach and support positive behavior for all students. With P.B.I.S., instructional time is more effectively used for teaching and the overall school environment is calm and conducive to learning.

The Three B's At Colby Elementary

Be Respectful Be Responsible Be Safe

At Colby Elementary, our school's expectations are:

Be Respectful

- * Follow directions the first time given
- * Use appropriate school language, tone, and voice
- * Respect all property

Be Responsible

- * Be ready to work with all needed materials
- * Actively participate
- * Be an attentive listener

Be Safe

- * Keep hands and feet to yourself
 - * Remain in assigned location
 - * Enter/Exit in orderly fashion
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What Happens When Your Child Follows The Three B's?

When students follow these expectations, the educational plan can be implemented at its best. Students are taught (model, demonstrate, rehearse, or role-play) how to demonstrate positive behaviors through behavior expectation lesson plans. These are taught throughout the school environment including:

- * Classroom
- * Hallway
- * Bathroom
- * Lunchroom
- * Playground
- * Early Bird Setting (Gym)
- * Assembly
- * Bus

Students will receive "Bee Slips" when displaying positive behaviors in these areas.

Appropriately acknowledging and rewarding the positive behavior of students is among the most effective ways to decrease problematic behavior and essential to strengthening the repeated display of positive behavior in the school setting.
