Senior Tax Exchange Program (STEP)

The Colby School District has offered a Senior Tax Exchange Program (STEP) since 1997. Senior citizens are given the opportunity to work in the District and apply their earnings toward payment of school property taxes. To qualify you must be 62 years of age or older, receive Social Security and have taxable property within the Colby School District. The STEP worker is compensated at \$7.25 per hour with a maximum of 66 hours per household per calendar year. The compensation is distributed bi-annually in the form of a two party check made out to the worker and the appropriate treasurer.

Examples of jobs are: reading with a child, groundskeeping, shelving books, assisting with computers, clerical work, tutoring, preparing bulletin boards, construction projects, etc.

Board members discussed payment of board member expenses. Currently board members receive mileage for travel in and out of the district, payment for conference/workshop registrations and lodging if necessary. Some board members thought this policy should be looked at in light of current budget reductions. These changes if necessary need to be addressed at the Annual Meeting.

The Policy Committee will review Board Policy as it pertains to the new Concealed Carry Law.

Each contractor was asked to reduce 1 bus and contracts included a 1.9% increase for 2011-12 and 2012-13 along with an adjusted fuel escalation clause.

RESOLUTION 2011-A

RESOLUTION ADOPTING A GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE TO ADDRESS EMPLOYEE TERMINATIONS, EMPLOYEE DISCIPLINE AND WORKPLACE SAFETY AS REQUIRED BY WIS. STAT. § 66.0509(1m)

WHEREAS, 2011 Wisconsin Act 10 created Wis. Stat. § 66.0509(1m), which requires local units of government to establish a civil service system or grievance procedure that addresses employee terminations, employee discipline and workplace safety no later than October 1, 2011; and

WHEREAS, the Colby Board of Education believes that it is in the best interests of all stakeholders in government to create a fair and equitable system for resolving employee grievances surrounding terminations, discipline and workplace safety issues; and

WHEREAS, following study and deliberations, the Colby Board of Education has been presented with a final draft of a grievance procedure that addresses employee terminations, employee discipline and workplace safety as required by Wis. Stat. § 66.0509(1m); and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this Resolution to establish the attached Grievance Procedure as the official Grievance Procedure attached hereto as Exhibit A as its grievance procedure required by Wis. Stat. § 66.0509(1m).
